- I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Teaches fundamentals of patient care with laboratory experience in foods and fluids, elimination, moving patients, morning, afternoon and evening care, care of hospital equipment, means of providing special comforts and safety, and admission and discharge procedures.

Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to perform the basic nurse aide tasks.

- **III. REQUIRED BACKGROUND**: Applicants should be able to read and write at a basic level and be Able to communicate effectively. Desirable personal qualities include care and concern for the resident and a responsible mature attitude.
- **IV. COURSE CONTENT:** The student is afforded the opportunity to perform the procedures of a nurse aide as described in learner outcomes after having received proper demonstration by instructor.

Demonstrate turning a resident, using the logrolling technique.

Demonstrate performing range of motion for a dependent resident.	
Demonstrate ambulating a resident.	
Demonstrate positioning a dependent resident in a wheelchair.	
Demonstrate positioning a dependent resident in a supine and semi-supine position.

Demonstrate calculating Intake and Output and percentage of food eaten accurately.	
Demonstrate fastening internal feeding tubing to a resident's clothing.	
Demonstrate administration of a soap suds enema, tap water enema.	
Demonstrate changing a colostomy bag.	
Demonstrate collection of a stool specimen.	
Demonstrate placing a resident on a bedpan.	
Demonstrate offering a urinal to a male resident.	
Demonstrate catheter care.	
Demonstrate teaching a resident to perform range of motion exercises independently.	
Demonstrate teaching a resident to transfer independently.	
Demonstrate special positioning techniques to prevent pressure, contractures, and foot drop.
