Describe how to observe and report unusual changes in residents' health or behavior.

Describe importance of accurately reporting and charting all activities carried out for or with the resident by the nurse aide.

Match medical abbreviations and symbols with their definitions.

Describe basic anatomy and physiology of all body systems.

Describe care of a cancer resident.

Identify age related changes of senses.
